

# Sunday Supplement – Ephesians 2:11–22

*Christ Is Our Peace*

## Demolition

“People like us belong together; people unlike us don’t.” Paul confronts the walls of hostility, pride, preference, and division that separate people from one another and reminds believers that Christ came to tear those walls down.

## Foundation

God breaks down walls and binds us together. Everyone belongs in God’s family and household. Through the blood of Jesus, strangers become family and hostile people become one new humanity in Christ.

## Rebuild

Let Christ remove walls of hostility so peace with others becomes the framework. The gospel becomes visible when believers practice repentance, forgiveness, hospitality, honest conversations, and reconciliation.

## Renovation

A reconciled community becomes a reaching community. A renovated heart reveals God’s closeness by nurturing Godly community. When the church lives as one family under Christ, the world catches a glimpse of God’s grace and peace.

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## Reflection Questions

- Where have comfort or preference become walls between you and others?
- Who in your life or church community do you need to move toward instead of avoid?
- How has Jesus brought peace and reconciliation into your life?
- What practical step can you take this week to help build gospel-centered community?

## Suggested Next Steps

- Pray daily for God to expose any hostility, resentment, or prejudice in your heart.
- Share a meal or meaningful conversation with someone outside your normal circle.
- Practice peacemaking by listening carefully, confessing quickly, and forgiving generously.
- Join a small group, class, or serving team to deepen Christ-centered community.
- Memorize Ephesians 2:14 — “For he himself is our peace.”
